Anh-Thuy Nguyen (Vietnamese-American, b. 1983) investigates conflicting emotions and thoughts about existing between two cultures. She is a multimedia/transdisciplinary artist whose work spans photography, video, installation and performance art. Using her personal history as a resource, Nguyen's work delves deeply into conflicting emotions, feelings and thoughts by often portraying strikingly strange yet hauntingly beautiful visual manifestations of gain and loss.

Nguyen currently serves as the head of the photography program at Pima Community College in Tucson, Arizona. Her works are in permanent collections of Amarillo Museum of Art, Amarillo, Texas; Tucson Museum of Art, Tucson, Arizona; Center for Photography at Woodstock, Woodstock, New York; among others.
